


At Farncombe, we use White Rose Maths to support our teaching and learning in maths. The principles that underpin this programme are often referred to as a Mastery approach which focuses on spending time deepening and broadening children's understanding of mathematical concepts. This, in turn, helps pupils secure and consolidate their learning and build a better understanding of how the number system works.



Over the course of this term, it has been a joy to see the children working hard to use practical resources to support their thinking in maths. I have also been really impressed with how well the children have been applying their written skills when recording their work as number sentences.
